- The First Responders Day Act was enacted by the Province in 2013 to recognize and honour the work of "men and women who, in the early stages of an emergency, are responsible for the protection and preservation of life, property, evidence and the environment." - First Responders include volunteers and professionals who work as police officers, firefighters, military personnel, paramedics, medical evacuation pilots, dispatchers, nurses, doctors, emergency medical technicians and emergency managers.
- The month of May also marks National Physicians' Day (May 1),
 Emergency Preparedness Week (May 7 13) and National Nurses Week (May 8 14)
- Emergency Preparedness Week is a national awareness initiative since 1996. During Emergency Preparedness Week, Canadians are reminded to get familiar with potential risks in their area, make an emergency plan specific to their household and build a 72-hour emergency kit.
